Rewards and sanctions

SCHOOL AND CLASS RULES

Children in KS2 are expected to follow the Golden rules which are discussed frequently and displayed prominently around school.

In addition each class devises its own set of class rules which are displayed in classrooms and referred to when necessary.

Children's behaviour at BSA is generally good and staff work towards accentuating the positive. The aim should be to give out many more smiley face cards than wobbly face cards to affirm appropriate behaviour.

REWARDS

Smiley faces are used in KS2 to reward academic achievement, good behaviour, good manners, kindness to others etc.

Hierarchy:

- Verbal or written praise
- Smiley face (which then becomes a house point too)
- Certificates for multiples of 10 to be given out in KS assembly
- Bronze for 30, silver for 60 and gold for 90 to be given out in Primary assemblies.
- Other rewards include sending children to another teacher/KS leader or Deputy to show work.
- On the playground we also give a thumbs up when children have done something good. 3 thumbs up = behaviour merit card from KS Leader. After 3 behaviour merit cards children are presented with a special certificate in assembly.

A tick chart for lining up is kept for the class which lines up the best after each break time. The class that gets the most ticks in a week gets an extra football break. Any class not getting three ticks in a week loses their football break for the following week.

SANCTIONS

When behaviour is unacceptable then a hierarchy of sanctions is put into place.

- A warning look
- A verbal warning
- Time out
- Staying in and missing part/all of break time.
- A warning card is given. After receiving one card the child misses 5 minutes of Golden time, a note is written in the child's diary and a record kept in KS2 behaviour folder. Two cards= loss of 10 minutes of Golden time missed, note in diary and record kept in KS2 behaviour folder. Three cards= loss of all golden time, note in diary, record in KS2 behaviour folder.
- 3 full detentions = loss of all Golden time and parents asked to come into school to see KS Leader/ Deputy Head/Head teacher.
- Continued unacceptable behaviour will lead to internal exclusion in half day increments and ultimately temporary suspension or permanent exclusion.

Warning cards are removed at the end of the week to start a new week afresh.
